NATIONAL DUES SCHEDULE

Dues for consumers of metallic materials are based on annual gross sales. Annual gross sales are calculated by using the ratio of scrap purchases to total raw material purchases multiplied by the total gross sales. To determine your annual dues, find the appropriate dues category below that matches your company's annual gross sales. Then write your dues category and annual dues amount on the membership application.

* Payment of membership dues is deductible for most members of a trade association under Section 162 of the Internal Revenue Code as an ordinary and necessary trade or business expense and is not deductible as charitable contributions for federal income tax purposes. Due to the Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993, a percentage of ISRI's national membership dues will no longer be deductible as a business expense. This nondeductible percentage reflects the portion of ISRI's expenses used for "lobbying" as defined by the act. The nondeductible percentage of your 2008 national dues is 30 percent.
